### **ITINERARY**

#### Saturday, August 28, 2010 ARRIVE CHRISTCHURCH, NEW ZEALAND

Welcome to Christchurch, New Zealand! After clearing passport control, please claim your luggage to clear customs. Once through customs, you will be met by our transfer agent, who will accompany the group to the hotel. The balance of the day is at leisure.

#### Accommodation: Camelot Cathedral Square

#### Sunday, August 29, 2010 CHRISTCHURCH / DUNEDIN

Breakfast at the hotel. Your driver-guide will be at the hotel at 8:15 a.m. You will leave the hotel promptly at 8:30 a.m. to travel to Geraldine for the Lord of the Rings tour. We toured here before the stars arrived. Travelling through this mighty landscape, we observed the crew build the movie set, film the movies, and then put the site back the way they found it when finished. Now, let us take you into this amazing area and talk you through the many aspects of the region that appear on the big screen. We can show you the *Misty Mountain*, the valley where *Helms Deep* appears, the hill where *Aragorn* rode his horse when travelling from *Endoras* to *Helms Deep* and most importantly where *Endoras* stood on top of Mt. Sunday. See where *Gandalf* rode from *Endoras* with *Pippin* crossing the river and the mighty armies galloped of to help defend *Minas Tirith* and much more. Let us transport you in airconditioned comfort on board a special purpose 4x4 vehicle across the crystal clear snow fed braided rivers and deep to *Middle Earth*. Experience being the only ones in this vast expansive valley. With this exclusive access, you will enjoy the peace and tranquility of this alpine wilderness wonderland while taking the time to capture some awesome images with your cameras. A picnic lunch will be served.

Afterward, leave Geraldine for Oamaru to enjoy the Blue Eyed Penguin Colony. As the evening draws in, view the penguins coming ashore toward their nests. You will be seated in an outdoor viewing area, where you will listen to an informative commentary about New Zealand's blue penguins. The birds return home from their day of fishing and make their way onto the beach, up a stony ramp, and cross into the Colony. This happens at different times during the year as daylight/nightlight change. During the summer months, evening viewing is as late as 9:00 p.m. and during the winter, the birds arrive home as early as 5:30 p.m. Arrival numbers vary from summer to winter from up to 180 birds in the summer to under 30 in the winter. *Note:* Evenings in Oamaru can be cool, so warm clothing is advised. For the protection of the birds, there is a no camera/filming policy. Binoculars are permitted.

You will leave Oamaru at approximately 6:00 p.m. to travel to the city of Dunedin. You will reach your hotel at approximately 7:30 p.m. **Accommodation: Cargills Hotel (B,L)** 



#### Monday, August 30, 2010 DUNEDIN / WANAKA

Breakfast at the hotel. You leave the hotel at 9:30 a.m. to travel to the Royal Albatross Colony on the tip of the Otago Peninsula. This is the only mainland-breeding colony for any albatross species found in the Southern Hemisphere. The first Taiaroa-reared albatross chick flew in 1938 and this now protected nature reserve has grown into an established colony with a population of around 140 birds. Your guided tour includes the introductory *Attenborough* video, albatross breeding cycle information and Colony viewing from the Richdale Observatory. Then get a glimpse of New Zealand's colonial past with a visit to Fort Taiaroa, underground fortifications beneath the Albatross Colony. Walk through the underground tunnels to the 1886 Armstrong Disappearing Gun that is still in working order. This was established to counter the anticipated threat of invasion from Tsarist Russia.

Next, it's on to Larnach Castle, where there will be time for lunch (own expense) in the café before your guided tour. This is New Zealand's only castle, which was built in 1871 by the merchant baron and politician William Larnach for his beloved first wife Eliza. It took over 200 workmen three years to build the castle shell, and master European craftsmen spent a further 12 years embellishing the interior. Larnach spared no expense on his dream home, which features the finest materials from around the world. Scandalous and tragic stories, spectacular tower views and a garden of international significance complete this enjoyable experience.

You will leave the Otago Peninsula at approximately 2:30 p.m. to travel to Wanaka. You will reach your hotel at approximately 6:30 p.m. Accommodation: Edgewater Resort (B)

#### Tuesday, August 31, 2010 WANAKA / HOKITIKA

Breakfast at the hotel. Leave the hotel at 8:30 a.m. for Fox Glacier. At 8 miles, Fox Glacier is the longest of the awe-inspiring New Zealand West Coast glaciers. At its head, soaring peaks of over 10,000 ft. dominate the vista. These include Aoraki (Mt. Cook) and Mt. Tasman. This mighty moving river of ice falls a little over 8,000 ft. on its journey from the base of the Southern Alps to the West Coast. New Zealand's West Coast glaciers are unique and probably the most accessible glaciers in the world, as they terminate amongst temperate rainforest just 820 ft. above sea level. So special is this mountain environment, that it forms part of the South Westland World Heritage Area. Upon arrival, there is time for a light lunch in one of the local cafes (own expense) before your guided Glacier Walk (1:15 p.m.). This popular walk is a great introduction to the frozen world of Fox Glacier. The friendly guides will lead you onto the ice via a secret track through bush regenerating from previous glacial advances. Your guide will share with you his/her enthusiasm and knowledge of the geology of the area, whilst you walk on the glacier viewing its stunning ice features.

**Note:** Please bring 3 to 4 layers of warm upper body clothing. (Jeans are not recommended on wet days as they become very cold and uncomfortable to wear.) You'll



need sunglasses and sun protection. Your own boots and raincoats may be suitable. Additional appropriate outer clothing will be provided.

During winter months, we recommend a warm hat and gloves. You may wish to carry a drink and snacks.

For those guests who purchased the optional Heli-Hike, please be advised of the following.

The fly-in, fly-out heli-hike combines the excitement of walking on the Fox Glacier with the thrill of helicopter flights. By flying in you are able to access and explore a part of the glacier where its forces work hardest and often create spectacular ice caves and arches. Equipped with sturdy leather boots and other equipment (provided at the excursion site), you board the helicopter for your first flight over the pinnacles of the lower icefall. Here, the ice is in constant motion. You then circle the upper icefall and Victoria Falls before landing. Your landing site on the ice is a remote and exceptionally beautiful part of the glacier. At this stage, your guide outfits you with crampons, specially designed for these ice conditions and you follow the ice steps cut by your guide as you explore the amazing formations and ice caves which are only seen here. Each departure is a true voyage of exploration. There are so many changing features that the guides always find something new. Ice time is approximately 2.5 hours, weather permitting.

**Note:** This is a natural and ever changing environment. Ice features change constantly and no guarantee can be given that specific features will be seen. Heli-hike trips are weather dependent.

**Please bring:** 3 to 4 layers of warm upper body clothing (jeans are not recommended on wet days, as they become very cold and uncomfortable to wear), sunglasses and sun protection. A daypack is useful and a drink and snacks are nice to have. Your own raincoat may be suitable. For winter trips, bring a warm hat and gloves. You will be provided with sturdy leather boots and other equipment at the excursion site, including appropriate outer clothing. You will leave the Fox Glacier at approximately 4:45 - 5:00 p.m. to travel to Hokitika. You will reach your hotel at approximately 6:45 - 7:00 p.m. Accommodation: Beachfront Hotel (B)

#### Wednesday, September 01, 2010 HOKITIKA / GREYMOUTH / CHRISTCHURCH

Breakfast at the hotel. Leave the hotel at 8:15 a.m. You drop in the Jade Factory in Hokitika for a brief visit before continuing on to Shantytown. Widely recognized as one of New Zealand's leading culture and heritage attractions, Shantytown has over 30 historic buildings in this recreated 19<sup>th</sup> century pioneer town inspired by the West Coast gold rushes of the 1860s. Its peaceful setting amongst regenerating native forest gives visitors the opportunity to step back in time, experience a range of activities and view fascinating relics from days one by. Shantytown's surrounds and historical theme provide a stunning backdrop for photography enthusiasts. Highlights include riding the steam train, gold panning, and



having an old time portrait taken (own expense) as a memento of your visit. Everybody's Tearooms and the Golden Nugget Saloon provide for your refreshment (own expense).

Then, drive to nearby Greymouth to board the TransAlpine Express for one of the top six train journeys in the world. For a little over four hours, you will ride through the spectacular Southern Alps including famed Arthur's Pass to Christchurch. The scenery on this route is world-class, and it's easy to take great photos from the open-air viewing car. On arrival in Christchurch (approximately 6:05 p.m.), you will transfer to the hotel. **Accommodation: Camelot Cathedral Square (B)** 

## Thursday, September 02, 2010 DEPART CHRISTCHURCH

Breakfast at the hotel. The following visits/activities are included.

**9:00 a.m.: Christchurch Tram Ride**: A unique way to view the heart of Christchurch City, in the South Island of New Zealand. Ride through the city center in the delightful restored vintage trams, while your tram driver gives an informative commentary. The entire trip takes about 25 minutes. (The Tram junction is in Cathedral Square – just a two-minute walk away.)

**9:30 a.m.:** Return to the hotel lobby for your luggage and coach departure. (The luggage should be brought to the lobby before you head off for the Tram Ride.)

9:45 a.m.: Leave the hotel for the Gondola.

10:00 – 10:45 a.m.: Christchurch Gondola: Welcome Aboard the Christchurch Gondola, the first and only Gondola in Christchurch City. Take a spectacular ride far above the city, as your 4-person cabin lifts you gently up to 1500 ft. above sea level over the 3100-ft. ride. Stunning 360° views extend over Pegasus Bay and the Pacific Ocean to Kaikoura; over Banks Peninsula, Lake Ellesmere and Lyttleton Harbour, and across the Canterbury Plains to the Southern Alps. (Leave at 10:45 a.m. for Willowbank Wildlife Reserve.)

**11:30 a.m.: Willowbank Wildlife Reserve:** Willowbank Wildlife Reserve is a unique Christchurch attraction and a journey into New Zealand. It does not pretend nor wish to be a zoo. It accepts the responsibility and guardianship that goes with preserving and promoting wildlife conservation within New Zealand. Nowhere else in New Zealand will you find such a wide range of New Zealand wildlife so close to you. Willowbank provides you with a "Kiwi Guarantee" and is home to New Zealand's largest and most accessible kiwi viewing area. With this unique experience, you will see the natural splendor firsthand and see Kiwis that are not displayed behind glass. (Leave at 12:30 p.m. for Antarctic Centre.)

**12:45 p.m.: Christchurch Antarctic Centre and Hagglund Ride:** Established in 1992, the Antarctic Attraction is located in the heart of a working Antarctic campus at Christchurch International Airport. It is from here that many Antarctic missions are organized. With this in mind the Antarctic Attraction is designed to bring a powerful and



memorable experience of Antarctica to visitors in a fun, exciting, informative and commercially successful way. Climb aboard the amazing Hagglund genuine as-used-in-Antarctica all terrain vehicle, and sit back, hold on and experience travelling across rough terrain in this unique and exciting machine! We aim to simulate the same travelling conditions, as scientists would experience riding in a Hagglund across the ice pack. This 15-minute ride is the only one of its type in the world. It showcases the demanding capabilities of the Hagglund ATV. Upon conclusion (1:45 p.m.), transfer to the Christchurch International Airport for your onward flight. We take with us fond memories, images of the beautiful scenery and the many mementos we found along the way. **(B)**

#### **BAGGAGE INFORMATION**

Please note regulations regarding airline baggage allowances are constantly changing. You are advised to check with your airline or travel agent in advance of traveling, to ensure that your baggage conforms to such regulations in force. Brendan cannot accept liability for passengers traveling with baggage exceeding the permitted airline allowances, or the sizes and weights.

#### AIRPORT AND AIRLINE SECURITY

It is important that you arrive at the airport at least two hours before domestic flights and three hours in advance for international flights. This will allow you time to check in your baggage and present your passport and ticket; get seat assignments and boarding passes, if you have not already done so; and pass through security procedures to the boarding area. All sharp objects and liquids should be stored inside the luggage you are checking in. Please contact your air carrier for specific policies on checking in liquids. Otherwise, they are likely to be confiscated if they are kept in your hand luggage.

#### AIRLINE DELAYS

Airfares, airline regulations and schedules are subject to change without notice. We are unable to reimburse you for any services or parts of a vacation program that are missed due to travel delays beyond our control. For this reason, we strongly recommend that you purchase a travel protection plan for your own protection.

#### VALUABLES

Do not take anything with you that will create an emotional or financial hardship if lost or stolen. Leave keys, as well as, favorite or expensive jewelry at home. Carry all documents, money, passport, tickets, traveler's checks, drivers' license, photocopy of your hotel contacts, cash and credit cards with you. However, don't put them all in the same place to limit the inconvenience in case they are lost. Do not carry these important items in your suitcase or hand luggage. You may find a money belt (worn inside clothing) useful while traveling. Never leave your hand luggage unattended or out of sight. Remember to make a final check of your hotel room before departure to ensure that you have not left anything behind. There is no guarantee that forgotten items will be returned to you either during or after your trip.

#### MEDICAL
