## CORE TOUR

## AUGUST 21 (Tues.) – Depart USA

Board your transpacific flight.

## AUGUST 22 (Wed.) - Osaka

Arrive in Japan and meet your Tour Director for transfer to your hotel in Osaka.

#### AUGUST 23 (Thurs.) - Osaka - Kyoto

Tour OSAKA CASTLE, then on to Kyoto. Visit a Zen rock garden at RYOANJI TEMPLE and then CHOIN-IN, a temple housing the country's largest bell which takes 17 monks to ring, before arriving at your hotel. Shabu-Shabu (Japanese style fondu) dinner. (B,D)

#### AUGUST 24 (Fri.) - Kyoto

City tour featuring NIJO CASTLE, built in 1603 as the official residence of Shogun Tokugawa Ieyasu. Next is Kinkakuji, the TEMPLE OF THE GOLD PAVILION, and the HEIAN SHRINE and GARDEN. Afternoon journey to Nara, the oldest capital of Japan, to see the great image of Buddha, a deer park and BYODOIN TEMPLE, before returning to Kyoto in the late afternoon. (B,D)

#### AUGUST 25 (Sat.) - Kyoto

Visit the OLD IMPERIAL PALACE, located on its present site since the 12<sup>th</sup> century and home to the imperial family from 1331 to 1868. Next is the KYOTO COOKING SCHOOL to learn about Japanese cooking and have lunch. Afternoon at leisure. (B,L)

#### AUGUST 26 (Sun.) – Kyoto-Fushimi-Kanazawa

Travel along the Sea of Japan to the FUSHIMI INARI SHRINE, with its thousands of brightly colored Torii Gates. Witness an exclusive performance of MIKO (Shinto girls). Then head to Kanazawa for a tour of KENROKU-EN, the "Garden of Six Qualities," dating from the 1670s. Adjacent to the garden is the ISHIKAWA PREFECTURE CRAFTS MUSEUM, displaying traditional crafts, including the locally famous Kanazawa Haku gold leaf, produced since 1593. (B,D)

#### AUGUST 27 (Mon.) - Kanazawa

Visit a local family for tea and get a firsthand glimpse of Japanese life at home by talking with the family and experiencing Japanese culture first hand. Lunch on your own, followed by a trip to Kanazawa's Kitchen, a 300 year-old open air market. Browse through the many stalls to get a good idea of the local diet and commerce. (B) <u>Note</u>: It is customary to bring a small gift from your local area to share with the family.

## AUGUST 28 (Tues.) – Kanazawa-Shirakawa-Takayama

Drive through the mountainous Shokawa Valley to Shirakawa. This remote region of Japan is home to several UNESCO World Heritage Sites due to the unique GASSHO-ZUKURI (joined hands) style thatched houses that can be found only here. Continue to the quiet, isolated town of Takayama, where old traditions are untouched by the passage of time. Balance of the day at leisure, perhaps to explore the narrow streets where artisans sell traditional crafts. (B,D)

#### AUGUST 29 (Wed.) – Takayama

Visit the morning market, where farmers display locally grown fruits, vegetables, and flowers. Then on to the San-Machi Suji historic district, famous for sake distilleries and tiny lacquerware shops where merchants buy and sell as they have for 300 years. Visit the KUSAKABE HERITAGE HOUSE for a glimpse of traditional Japanese architecture of the late 19th century. In the afternoon, see the HIDA MINZOKU-MURA FOLK VILLAGE, a collection of traditional buildings and farmhouses, as well as numerous artifacts relating to the life and work of the local villagers. Enjoy demonstrations of crafts such as lacquer work, silk dying, basket making and wood carving. Japanese style dinner hosted by your Tour Director. (B,D)

AUGUST 30 (Thurs.) – Takayama-Matsumoto-Tokyo Journey to Matsumoto, gateway to the Japanese Alps. See MATSUMOTO CASTLE, dating back to 1593, as well as the JAPAN FOLKLORE MUSEUM. After lunch, continue to Tokyo where you will be dropped off at your convention hotel. (B)

## AUGUST 19 (Sun.) – Depart USA

Board your transpacific flight.

#### AUGUST 20 (Mon.) - Osaka

Arrive in Japan and meet your Tour Director for your transfer to your hotel in Osaka

## AUGUST 21 (Tues.) – Osaka – Kurashiki

Head to Kurashiki to visit a KILN OF BIZEN-YAKI POTTERY before driving to Himeji to see HIMEJI CASTLE, known as the White Heron Castle. (B)

## AUGUST 22 (Wed.) – Kurashiki-Hiroshima

Visit the OHARA ART GALLERY before departing for Hiroshima. See the SHUKKEIEN LANDSCAPE GARDEN, PEACE PARK, and MEMORIAL HALL, memorializing victims of the atomic bomb. (B)

## AUGUST 23 (Thurs.) -Hiroshima-Kyoto

Travel to MIYAJIMA ISLAND to see the Itsukushima Shrine, noted for its floating Tori Gate. Afternoon trip on one of Japan's famous bullet trains bound for Kyoto. Join your fellow traveling companions for sightseeing and dinner in Kyoto per Day 3 on the standard itinerary. (B,D)
